

Under the influence of neoliberalism and the rise of the New Economy in the 2000s the nexus between artistic and aesthetic practices and discourses, on the one hand, and postmodern forms of labor, on the other, has garnered significant attention from the fields of cultural and social science research. In particular, the "creativity dispositive" ("Kreativitätsdispositiv") diagnosed by Andreas Reckwitz has received increased attention. In the course of current developments in the field of artificial intelligence, it is precisely the creative sector and the various areas of "intellectual" labor associated with it whose practices and working methods are being fundamentally called into question.

The workshop would like to start here and put the praxeological and discourse-analytical findings on the role of creativity to the test. What implications does the current development in the field of AI have for our understanding of creativity as a social and economic dispositive? Are new forms of subjectivation emerging? What contributions can praxeological approaches make to updating their diagnoses without losing the complexity already achieved?
